### **REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS**

A child must be five (5) years old before August 1, 2023, to enroll in Wellington-Napoleon R-IX Schools. No student will be allowed to enter school without updated immunizations in accordance with Missouri state laws. Student fees or fines owed from the previous school year must be paid prior to enrollment. Secondary students participating in athletics must have a completed physical form on file before participation is allowed. Each school office has forms available. ### RESOURCES FOR FINANCIAL HARDSHIPS

#### Free or Reduced Breakfast/Lunch

Our federal government provides funding to schools to help families in need through a variety of programs. One of those programs is for families needing assistance with paying for school breakfast and lunch. Anyone displaced or experiencing a loss of income, living with a family member other than parent (such as a grandparent, aunt, uncle, or even friend), receiving any government assistance or whose income qualifies for assistance can receive free or reduced pricing on school breakfast and lunch. This program not only helps the families, it also helps the school. The more families that qualify for these programs, the more federal funding our school receives for additional academic programing. This program is designed to help you, your family, and the school. This is a confidential program where students who qualify receive the same meals as students who pay. In the past few years, our district's free and reduced numbers have decreased, yet it is strongly felt that the need among our students and community has increased. This means that we are missing families we could be assisting, perhaps in part because the application form isn't being completed or submitted. Each family will be asked to complete this application as a part of the enrollment process.

#### **Health Insurance for Kids**

MO HealthNet for Kids (formerly MC+ for Kids) is a low-cost or free health insurance for children. It is based on family income and household size. For more information call 1-888-275-5908. Your children may be eligible if they meet the following requirements: Family's income falls within the eligibility guidelines or child is without insurance for a minimum of 30 days. #### **Lafayette County Children's Service Fund Grants**

The Lafayette County Children's Service Fund is funded through a 1/8th of a cent sales tax measure that was approved in 2005 by the citizens of Lafayette County. The funds are awarded to local agencies that provide services to children and youth ages 19 or less in Lafayette County.

#### Wellington-Napoleon R-IX Schools has been funded for the following three grants through the LCCSF:

Sensory Room: This is the sixth year our sensory room has been funded, which provides WN students with school based prevention services. We are very fortunate to have a sensory room to help ensure our students are successful throughout the school day. Staffed by Devin Graf, OTA, and Stacey Grimpo, the room serves students, Pre-K to 12th grade, within our school who have shown signs of distress holding them back from making academic progress. Services provided support students with ADD, ADHD, Anxiety, Depression, Sensory Disorders, or other physical and mental health issues such as trauma, PTSD, etc. When students visit the sensory room, they have a sensory plan that consists of physical exercises they work through to meet their sensory needs. Some exercises are alerting, some for calming, others for movement and balance which creates focus in the brain. Students work through these exercises then return to class ready for academic success.

School-Based Therapist: We are in the third year of grant funding to provide the students and families of WN with a full time Licensed Professial Counselor. Bailey Williams serves in the role of school-based therapist for WN R-IX. With this grant funding, our SBT and school counselors are able to serve WN students in need of therapy. Through school-based mental health, students have created stronger relationships with family, peers, and teachers. Students reccieving school based therapy gain support and coping skills to better prepare them for social, emotional, and academic endeavors.

School Resource Officer: The Wellington-Napoleon R-IX Schools have partnered with LCCSF and the Lafayette County Sheriff's Department to supply a part-time School Resource Officer to the district. The SRO provides a valuable resource to WN in safety, support, and educational services to the students, staff, and the community of Wellington-Napoleon. School safety is of utmost importance to our district and the resources provided by our SRO assist in safety and crime prevention; ensuring a safe learning environment exists for all. Additional services provided by our SRO include DARE education, student and staff professional development, and working as an advocate/liaison for students and families through the Lafayette County Sheriff's Department. The School Resource Officer for the 2023-24 school year is Brooke Nail.

### **SPECIAL SERVICES NEWS**

Wellington-Napoleon offers a variety of Special Programs to meet the needs of all students. Each program is designed to ensure students are successful in their academic achievements. The following programs are offered:

#### **SPECIAL EDUCATION:**

Wellington-Napoleon School District provides a free, appropriate public education in the least restrictive environment to all eligible children with disabilities from the ages of 3 to 21. Disabilities include: -Autism -Deaf/blindness -Emotional Disorders -Hearing impairments and deafness -Mental retardation-Intellectual Disabilities -Multiple disabilities -Orthopedic impairment -Other health impairments -Specific learning disabilities -Speech or language impairment -Traumatic brain injury -Visual impairment/ blindness -Young child with developmental delay. For children ages 3 - 5, the Early Childhood Special Education program offers similar services for kids demonstrating disabilities or significant developmental delays. The Early Childhood students may be transported to Lexington and attend the Lexington Early Childhood Center. For K-12 students, appropriate services are offered in regular and special education settings. The related services of speech and language therapies, occupational therapy, and physical therapy are also provided as needed. #### **504 ACCOMMODATION PLANS:**

Wellington-Napoleon follows Section 504, which is a Civil Rights Law (not a special education law) that protects the rights of individuals with disabilities in programs and activities that receive federal financial assistance. This law requires the District to provide written assurances of nondiscrimination, designate a district level 504 Coordinator, provide non-discrimination notice to students and parents, identify and locate qualified children with disabilities, and provide parents or quardians with procedural safeguards and grievance procedures. The definition of a disability under Section 504 is broadly expressed as a physical or mental condition that substantially limits one or more major life activity. #### **PARENTS AS TEACHERS:**

Parents As Teachers is free of charge to all families with children ages birth to five years. During home visits parents receive ideas for activities to do with their children as well as information about language, intellectual, social and motor development. Vision, hearing and developmental screenings are part of the home visit for children under three. Screenings for children 3 to 5 are held at school in April. Evening meetings on various topics, including nutrition and reading, are held periodically throughout the school year. 




